- **1. Subject Name:** PRINCIPLES OF INJURY DIAGNOSIS IN HOSPITAL EMERGENCY ROOMS AND WARDS.

Course Objectives:** To acquire knowledge regarding the diagnosing of life-threatening injuries and the ability to make appropriate decisions in the diagnostic and therapeutic process for trauma patients. Acquire the ability to interpret a small amount of patient information while maximising the use of data from the anamnesis and physical examination.

- **6. Form of classes and number of hours for each form of classes:** Optional classes (seminars) either stationary or on-line (to be determined with doctoral students); 15 hours.

#### 8. Teaching methods:

- I. Case study method: Analysis of authentic cases of medical errors involving the failure to diagnose serious injuries (craniocerebral, thoracic and abdominal) in hospital that resulted in patients' fatalities.
- II. Comparative method: Comparison of the analysed cases with other cases from everyday clinical practice.

#### 9. Learning outcomes

Knowledge: Acquisition of knowledge regarding the causes of failure to diagnose lifethreatening injuries. Understanding of the general principles enabling the correct and early recognition of these injuries. Familiarity with the decision-making process in diagnostics and therapy for trauma patients.

Skills: Developing the ability to make accurate decisions in the early stages of patient care. Drawing appropriate conclusions from limited information, especially from patients with whom verbal contact is impaired.
