1. **Subject Name:** MECHANISMS OF BODILY INJURIES.

3. **Course Objectives:** To acquire knowledge on the mechanisms of injury (penetrating, blunt; direct, indirect; active, passive) and to apply this information in daily clinical practice.

 - I. Integrated method: Presentation of learning material, questions and answers and discussion to provide context and summarise larger portions of learning material.
 - II. Case study method: Analysis of authentic bodily injuries cases, with particular emphasis on injuries occurring in unusual and surprising circumstances.
 - II. Comparative method: Comparison of the analysed cases with other cases from everyday clinical practice.
9. **Learning outcomes**

Knowledge: Gaining knowledge of the mechanisms of injury in different areas of the body (head, chest, abdomen, limbs).

Skills: Acquiring of the ability to apply knowledge of the mechanisms of injury in everyday clinical practice, especially in situations where it is difficult to obtain complete information from the patient as part of the medical history. Drawing conclusions and extending the diagnosis on the basis of specific abnormalities found in the patient on physical examination.
