1. Course Title: Seminar for the Doctoral School "Photoprotection and Skin Care in Selected Dermatological Conditions"

4. Course Objectives: To provide current knowledge on the importance of photoprotection in the context of dermatological diseases, to discuss the mechanisms of UV radiation and its impact on healthy and diseased skin, to present the principles of selecting dermocosmetics and photoprotective agents for specific medical conditions, to develop skills in critical analysis of scientific literature in the field of dermatology, to develop competencies for providing patient education on skin care and UV protection.

7. Course format and number of hours for each course format: seminar, 5 hours

10. Prerequisites: basic medical knowledge in dermatology, immunology, and skin physiology, ability to analyze scientific literature, knowledge of medical terminology in Polish, openness to an interdisciplinary approach to patient care.

11. Teaching methods: oral communication, multimedia presentation

12. Course content:

1. Introduction to photoprotection:

- o Types of UV radiation and their effects on the skin.
- o Mechanisms of photoaging and photocarcinogenesis
- o Physical and chemical UV filters – overview and mechanisms of action.

2. Skin diseases and photoprotection needs:

- o The importance of photoprotection in selected diseases, e.g., rosacea and systemic lupus erythematosus

3. Photoprotection and skin cancers:

- o The role of UV radiation in the development of basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma, and melanoma
- o Photoprotective recommendations for oncology patients and those undergoing immunosuppressive treatment

4. Patient education:

- o How to effectively educate patients about sun protection?

5. Skin care in selected dermatological conditions:

- o Skin in patients with acne vulgaris – special care needs

- o Rosacea – how to choose appropriate dermocosmetic?
 - o What are emollients? How do they work? How should they be used in patients with atopic dermatitis?
6. Review and analysis of current scientific literature:
- o Review of the latest recommendations and guidelines (PTD, AAD, EADV).

13. Learning outcomes:

Knowledge:

- The PhD student possesses advanced theoretical knowledge regarding the effects of UV radiation on both healthy and diseased skin.
- The PhD student understands the mechanisms of various photoprotective methods and their importance in prevention and treatment of selected diseases.
- The PhD student knows the principles of selecting skincare and photoprotective agents in the context of the specific needs of patients with skin diseases.
- The PhD student is familiar with current polish and international guidelines and recommendations regarding photoprotection and skin care.

- The PhD student is able to analyze and interpret scientific literature in the field of dermatology related to photoprotection and skin care.
- The PhD student can recognize skincare needs of patients with selected skin conditions and select appropriate protective and supportive strategies.
- The PhD student uses specialized terminology related to photoprotection, dermatological cosmetology, and skin pathology.
- The PhD student can apply theoretical knowledge to propose practical therapeutic and educational solutions for patients.

- The PhD student is willing to share knowledge about photoprotection and skin care with other healthcare team members and patients.
- The PhD student demonstrates an awareness of the importance of health prevention and patient education in the context of skin protection and care.
